

ITINERARY IN DETAIL

Day 1: Day 1 – Kathmandu Sightseeing (1,500 m / 4,920 ft)

When you arrive in Kathmandu, you are welcomed at Tribhuvan International Airport and taken to your hotel to rest and freshen up. After checking in, the guided sightseeing tour begins.

- **Pashupatinath Temple:** Visit one of the most important Hindu temples in Nepal, located along the Bagmati River. Your guide explains the meaning of the daily rituals, cremation ceremonies, and the temple's role in Nepali spiritual life. You can watch devotees offering prayers and performing rituals.
- **Boudhanath Stupa:** This is one of the largest Buddhist stupas in the world. You walk around the stupa with pilgrims, watch monks carrying out rituals, and learn about Tibetan Buddhist practices. The monasteries around the stupa help you understand monastic life better.
- **Swayambhunath Stupa (Monkey Temple):** End the day with a visit to this hilltop stupa, which offers wide views of the Kathmandu Valley. The stupa carries both Buddhist and Hindu meanings, and the monkeys living there create a lively setting. Watching the sunset from here also gives great chances for photography.

Overnight stay is in Kathmandu.

Day 2: Day 2 – Lalitpur and Bhaktapur Tour (1,500 m / 4,920 ft)

The second day focuses on the historic cities outside Kathmandu, starting with Lalitpur (Patan) and then continuing to Bhaktapur.

- **Patan Durbar Square:** Explore the artistic center of Lalitpur, with its palaces, temples, and courtyards. Your guide explains the stone, wood, and metal craftsmanship, along with the history of the Malla kings who shaped the city.
- **Traditional Newari neighborhoods:** Walk through local streets to see houses that are hundreds of years old and daily life continuing among historic buildings. You may see artisans working on metal casting, pottery, and other crafts.
- **Drive to Bhaktapur:** A short and pleasant drive takes you to Bhaktapur, where the medieval streets and squares are still well preserved.

- **Walk through traditional neighborhoods:** Stroll through narrow alleys lined with pottery workshops, wood carving shops, and small temples, watching artisans at work and seeing local life up close.

Overnight stay can be in Kathmandu or Bhaktapur, depending on your preference and hotel choice.


Day 3: Day 3 – Cultural Walk and Departure (1,500 m / 4,920 ft)
