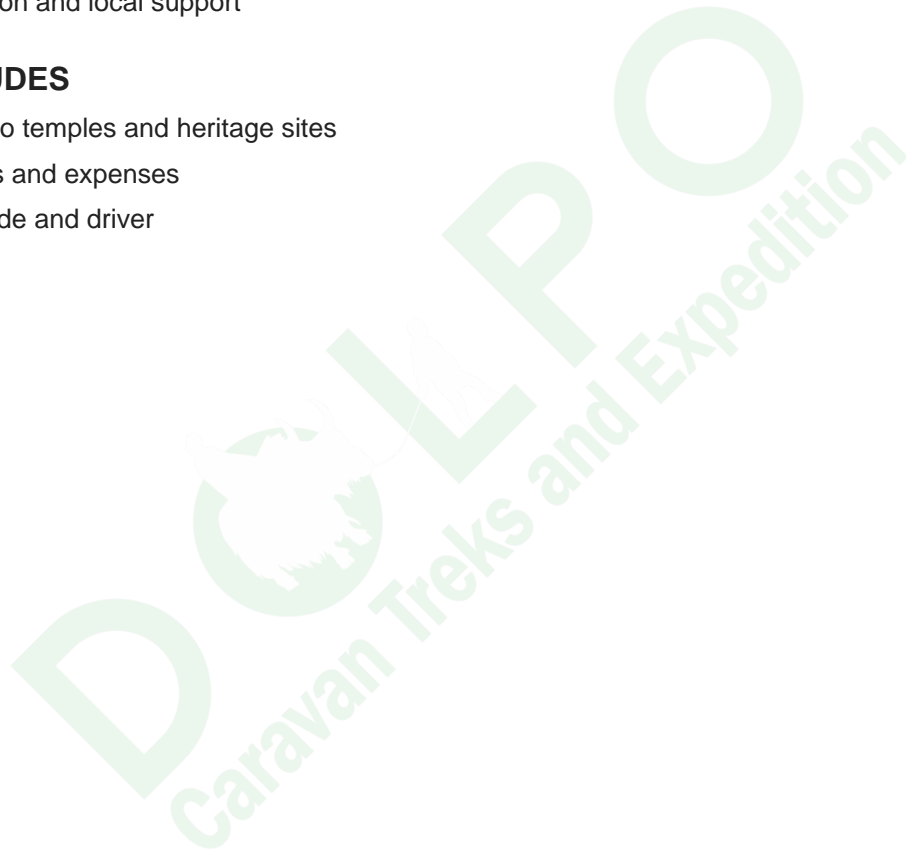

## ITINERARY IN DETAIL

### Day 1: Your Full Day in Kathmandu (1,400 m / 4,590 ft)

#### Hotel Pick Up and Morning Departure

The day begins with a hotel pick-up from your accommodation in Kathmandu. After a short briefing, you leave for the first site. Morning hours are used well to avoid crowds where possible and enjoy cooler temperatures.

#### Swayambhunath Stupa (Monkey Temple)

The tour starts at Swayambhunath Stupa, a hilltop Buddhist site overlooking the Kathmandu Valley. Known as the Monkey Temple, this stupa is one of the oldest religious monuments in Nepal. Walking clockwise around the stupa, you will see prayer wheels, shrines, and monks doing daily rituals. From this viewpoint, you get a clear view of Kathmandu's layout and the hills around it.

#### Pashupatinath Temple

Next is Pashupatinath Temple, the most sacred Hindu temple in Nepal, located along the Bagmati River. Dedicated to Lord Shiva, the complex is an active place of worship and ritual. From marked viewing areas, visitors can watch traditional cremation ceremonies and learn about Hindu beliefs about life, death, and rebirth. Your guide explains the religious and cultural meaning in a respectful and clear way.

#### Boudhanath Stupa

The journey continues to Boudhanath Stupa, one of the largest stupas in South Asia and a key site for Tibetan Buddhism. Pilgrims walk around the stupa while spinning prayer wheels, creating a calm and focused feeling. The area around it has monasteries, small shops, and cafés, giving insight into Buddhist community life in Kathmandu.

#### Kathmandu Durbar Square

In the afternoon, you visit Kathmandu Durbar Square, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that once served as the royal palace complex. The square has temples, courtyards, and palaces built in the traditional Newar architectural style. A main highlight is Kumari Ghar (House of the Living Goddess), where the living Kumari lives. This visit links Kathmandu's religious traditions with its royal history.

#### Optional Stops (Time Permitting)

If time allows, optional visits may include Patan Durbar Square, known for fine Newar craftsmanship, or Asan Bazaar, a traditional market area that shows daily urban life in Kathmandu.

## FAQ

### 1. What main sites will we visit on this tour?

On this one day Kathmandu tour, you will visit several important cultural and religious landmarks, including Swayambhunath Stupa (Monkey Temple), Pashupatinath Temple, Boudhanath Stupa, and Kathmandu Durbar Square. These sites are central to Kathmandu Valley sightseeing and show how Hinduism in Nepal and Buddhism in Nepal shape the city's heritage.

### 2. How long does the tour last?

The typical One Day Kathmandu Tour lasts about 6 to 8 hours, depending on traffic and how much time is spent at each site. Most tours start in the morning and finish in the late afternoon.

### 3. Is transportation included?

### 6. Can I customize the itinerary?

Yes. Because this tour is private, you can talk to your guide about changes, like spending more time at a favorite site or adding extra stops if there's time.

### 7. Is this tour suitable for families and children?

Yes. The pace of the tour and the accessibility of the sites make it suitable for most ages, including families with children. It's an easy Kathmandu day trip that balances cultural learning with comfort.

### 8. What should I expect for meals and refreshments?
