

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

ITINERARY IN DETAIL

Day 1: Day 1: Religious and Cultural Heritage (1,400 m / 4,590 ft)

Morning – Swayambhunath Stupa (Monkey Temple)

Your day starts with hotel pick-up in a private car with AC. Drive to Swayambhunath Stupa, sitting on a hill with a great view over Kathmandu Valley. Your guide will tell you all about its history. This Buddhist site is over 2,000 years old! Walk around, spin the prayer wheels, and watch monks doing their morning rituals.

There are also lots of monkeys here, which is why people call it the “Monkey Temple.” From the hill, you get amazing views of the valley, perfect for photos and seeing how the city looks from above.

Late Morning – Pashupatinath Temple

Next stop is Pashupatinath Temple, one of Nepal’s most sacred Hindu temples, dedicated to Lord Shiva. It’s along the Bagmati River, and you’ll see ceremonies, priests chanting, and even traditional cremation rituals along the riverbanks. Your guide will explain why these rituals are important and what role the temple plays in daily life in Nepal.

Afternoon – Boudhanath Stupa

After lunch (optional, at a nearby restaurant your guide recommends), head to Boudhanath Stupa. It’s one of the biggest stupas in South Asia and an important spot for Tibetan Buddhism. Walk clockwise around it, spin the prayer wheels, and watch pilgrims showing their devotion. Check out the monasteries nearby where monks chant, meditate, and hang out with the community. Your guide will explain the stupa’s meaning, history, and why it’s so important to both locals and visitors.

Evening – Optional Exploration & Return

Head back to your hotel, or if there’s time, go for a short guided walk in nearby neighborhoods or markets. You’ll see local life, street vendors, and small shrines. Your guide can also suggest restaurants for dinner or local dishes like dal bhat or momos.

Day 2: Day 2: Historic Squares, Markets, and Local Life (1,400 m / 4,590 ft)

Morning – Kathmandu Durbar Square

Start your second day at Kathmandu Durbar Square, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Walk through courtyards full of palaces, temples, and shrines. Visit the Kumari Ghar, where the Living Goddess lives, and learn about the old tradition of the Kumari. Your guide will tell you about the Malla dynasty, the temple architecture, and the rituals that still happen here today.

Late Morning – Patan Durbar Square

Next, drive a short distance to Patan Durbar Square in Lalitpur. Patan is famous for its Newar-style buildings, stone and wood carvings, and artisan workshops. Check out the old temples and watch local craftsmen making metal, wood, and stone art. Your guide will explain how Kathmandu and Patan Durbar Squares are different and why these

crafts are important in Nepali culture.

Afternoon – Asan Bazaar and Neighborhoods

After Patan, go to Asan Bazaar, a busy market that shows everyday life in the Kathmandu Valley. See vendors selling spices, clothes, and fresh food. Walk through nearby narrow streets and alleys and notice small temples, prayer flags, and street shrines. This part of the tour shows the city's living culture and lets you feel the daily rhythm of the locals.

Optional Stops – Bhaktapur or Artisan Workshops

If there's time, your guide may suggest visiting Bhaktapur Durbar Square, known for its medieval buildings, pottery, and old Newar streets. Or, you could stop at a local artisan workshop to watch traditional crafts being made.

Evening – Return to Hotel

Finish the tour with a relaxing drive back to your hotel. Your guide will make sure everything goes smoothly so you can enjoy the day without worrying.

FAQ

1. What main sites will we visit on this tour?

Swayambhunath Stupa, Pashupatinath Temple, Boudhanath Stupa, Kathmandu Durbar Square, Patan Durbar Square, and Asan Bazaar. You'll also see neighborhoods and markets to understand local life.

2. How long is each day of the tour?

Each day is about 6 to 8 hours, depending on traffic and time at sites.

3. Is transportation included?

Yes, a private air-conditioned vehicle with hotel pick-up and drop-off is included.

4. Are entrance fees included?

No, entrance fees are not included and should be paid at each site.

5. Can the itinerary be customized?
